ABOUT THE CENTER

The <u>Center for Evidence to Practice</u> was established in 2018, in collaboration with the Office of Behavioral Health to increase statewide access to best practices to address key behavioral health needs for Medicaid-insured children and families in Louisiana. In 2021, the efforts of the Center expanded to include the Louisiana Mental Health Crisis Response (MHCR) Workforce Training and Development initiative.

The Center, through its partnership with OBH, coordinates and delivers training to crisis providers who implement and render services under the Louisiana Crisis Response System (LA-CRS). The mission of this system is to execute a modern, innovative, and coordinated statewide crisis system that builds upon the existing needs, strengths and resources of Louisiana's Medicaid-serviced individuals and communities. This system includes call center(s), mobile crisis response, community brief crisis support, behavioral health crisis centers, and crisis stabilization providers.


Peers are an instrumental part of this training, and over 10 peers have participated in training delivery.


The Center worked with national and local experts to develop two videos and four fact sheets on working with the LGBTQ+ population placed on our learning platform and resource library, respectively.

SCHEDULE & REGISTRATION



Center for E2P releases training schedule of upcoming 6 months.



Agencies update Training Trackers to identify training needs bi-monthly.

Center sends WELCOME message with training details to identified trainees.



Trainees make an account via E2PLearn to begin training.



TRAINING PROCESS

- Trainees begin with pre-live training asynchronous modules and complete quizzes associated via E2PLearn.
 - Trainees complete another set of asynchronous modules and quizzes on E2PLearn
- Trainees attend two 4-hour days for virtual, live training on Zoom. Quizzes are completed on E2PLearn.
- Trainees attend last two 4-hour days for virtual, live training on Zoom. Quizzes are completed on E2PLearn.

Trainees complete evaluation survey to provide feedback on the training.

Certificate of Completion issued to those who have completed training requirements.




Participant training status by profession


CONSULTING SESSIONS
